Frequently Asked Question: Will there be any marine exclusion zones?

Marine exclusion zones will be set and managed by the Mid West Ports Authority. The exact location and size of these exclusion zones are still to be determined.

It is likely a smaller permanent exclusion zone will be put in place around the CALM buoy and a larger exclusion zone will apply during loading periods.
